

Conference on Case Management & Plea Bargaining

Jharkhand State Legal Services Authority (JHALSA) had organized a Conference on "Case Management and Plea Bargaining" on 17th March, 2012 at Nyaya Sadan premises, Ranchi.

In the said conference the experts from the higher Judiciary participated and expressed their views on speedy disposal of Court cases.

Hon'ble Mr. Justice M.Y.Eqbal, Chief Justice, Madras High Court, Hon'ble Mr. Justice, Prakash Tatia, Chief Justice, Jharkhand High Court Cum-Patron-in-Chief, JHALSA, Hon'ble Mr. Justice R.K.Merathia, Executive Chairman, JHALSA, Hon'ble Mrs. Justice Poonam Srivastav, Chairman, HCLSC, Hon'ble Judges of Jharkhand High Court, Mr. J.K.Verma, Senior Advocate, Patna High Court and other Judicial Officers from the State Judiciary participated in the conference.

Hon'ble Mr. Justice M.Y.Eqbal, Chief Justice, Madras High Court addressed the Judicial Officers, Advocates and other participants on Case Management and Plea Bargaining. His Lordship had kept his views on the matter. His Lordship said that "the pace of the case disposal depends on Courts and individual Judges. Presiding Judges should maintain a timetable and stick to them

and those responsible for distribution of cases to different courts should keep an eye on the rate of disposal of cases so that the court is not overburdened. A lot has been done to speed up case disposal still individual effort and sticking to certain standard procedures can effectively minimize the time consumed in disposal of case in average."

Hon'ble Mr. Justice Prakash Tatia, Chief Justice, Jharkhand High Court said that "the state of Jharkhand is fortunate to have lesser litigations in comparison to states like Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh. His Lordship clarified that there is difference between Court management and Case management. The role of the elements immensely responsible for the delayed disposal of cases was depreciated. His Lordship reiterated that the speedy disposal of cases remains priority of every Judge."

Sri J.K.Verma, Senior Advocate of Patna High Court has also expressed his views on the topic. The Hon'ble Judges interacted with the judicial officers and the participants and give them important tips for management and speedy disposal of court cases
