NALSA'S VISION INTO REALITY

JHARKHAND STATE LEGAL SERVICES AUTHORITY: TRANSLATING NALSA'S VISION INTO REALITY

The National Legal Services Authority (NALSA) was established with the objective of ensuring accessible, affordable, and effective justice for the weaker and marginalized sections of society. In this mission, the Jharkhand State Legal Services Authority (JHALSA) has emerged as a key institution, playing a proactive role in implementing NALSA's schemes and bringing its vision to life at the grassroots level.

Through the effective execution of various NALSA schemes, JHALSA is not only providing legal aid but also strengthening legal awareness and public trust in the legal services system. These schemes focus on vulnerable groups such as disaster victims, victims of trafficking, unorganized sector workers, children, persons with mental illness or disabilities, tribal communities, senior citizens, and acid attack survivors.

A significant aspect of this implementation in Jharkhand is the active role played by the District Legal Services Authorities (DLSAs). Functioning as the grassroots arms of JHALSA, DLSAs are instrumental in spreading awareness and ensuring the last-mile delivery of NALSA's schemes. Through legal awareness camps, village-level outreach programs, door-to-door campaigns, and the engagement of Para Legal Volunteers (PLVs), DLSAs ensure that information about legal rights and available schemes reaches even the most remote and underserved communities.

In a tribal-dominated state like Jharkhand, the implementation of the NALSA *Protection and Enforcement of Tribal Rights Scheme, 2015* has been particularly impactful. JHALSA, along with DLSAs, actively works to educate tribal communities about their rights over land, forests, and resources, while also facilitating legal assistance when needed. Similarly, under the *Legal Services to the Workers in the Unorganized Sector Scheme, 2015*, awareness drives and legal aid clinics organized at the district level help workers understand their rights and access welfare benefits.

JHALSA and DLSAs have also made significant strides in child protection through the *Child Friendly Legal Services Scheme, 2015*, ensuring that children receive legal support in a sensitive and supportive environment. Under the *Victims of Trafficking and Commercial Sexual Exploitation Scheme, 2015*, coordinated efforts at the district level contribute to rescue, rehabilitation, and access to justice for victims.

The Legal services Authorities in Jharkhand have further embraced NALSA's newly introduced initiatives such as the *JAGRITI Scheme, 2025*, *DAWN Scheme, 2025*, *SAMVAD Scheme, 2025*, and *SPRUHA Scheme, 2025*, with DLSAs organizing interactive sessions, community dialogues, and awareness drives to connect with unseen and underserved

populations. Additionally, schemes like the *Veer Parivar Sahayata Yojana, 2025* are being effectively implemented at the district level, ensuring timely legal assistance and support to affected individuals of Indian Armed Forces and their dependant families.

JHALSA, with the strong support of DLSAs, stands as a robust pillar in realizing NALSA's vision of "Justice for All." Through dedicated implementation, widespread awareness initiatives, and a deeply rooted grassroots approach, it ensures that justice is not confined to institutions but reaches every individual, especially those who need it the most.

साहिबगंज: उधवा में छात्राओं को सिखाए गए आत्मनिर्भरता के गुर 'बाल विवाह मुक्त भारत' अभियान के तहत दी गई कानूनी और साइबर सुरक्षा की जानकारी

साहिबगंज/उधवा :- 'बेटी बचाओ-बेटी पढ़ाओ' योजना और '100 दिवसीय बाल विवाह मुक्त भारत अभियान' के तहत शुक्रवार को साहिबगंज जिले के उधवा प्रखंड स्थित जी.एन. उच्च विद्यालय, अमानत पियारपुर में एक विशेष जागरूकता कार्यक्रम का आयोजन किया गया।

जिला समाज कल्याण पदाधिकारी संजय कुमार दास के निर्देश पर आयोजित इस कार्यक्रम में मंथन संस्था, चाइल्ड हेल्पलाइन, जिला विधिक सेवा प्राधिकार (DLSA) और गैर संस्थागत देखरेख इकाई ने संयुक्त रूप से भाग लिया। कार्यक्रम का संचालन करते हुए मंथन संस्था के समन्वयक अमन वर्मा ने छात्राओं को सशक्तिकरण,



आत्मनिर्भरता और आत्मरक्षा के कौशल सिखाए। उन्होंने छात्राओं को कठिन परिस्थितियों में साहसपूर्वक खड़े रहने के लिए प्रेरित किया। उन्होंने जोर देकर कहा, "बाल विवाह, बाल श्रम और शोषण जैसी सामाजिक कुरीतियों को जड़ से खत्म करने के लिए समाज की सामूहिक भागीदारी अत्यंत आवश्यक है।"

चाइल्ड हेल्पलाइन के समन्वयक मोहम्मद इकबाल ने छात्राओं को

सुरक्षा से जुड़े महत्वपूर्ण कानूनों के प्रति जागरूक किया। उन्होंने 'गुड टच-बैड टच', बाल विवाह निषेध, बाल श्रम, यौन शोषण और पीक्सो एक्ट (POCSO Act) के बारे में विस्तार से बताया। साथ ही किशोर न्याय अधिनियम (JJ Act), स्पॉन्सरशिप और फोस्टर केयर जैसी योजनाओं की जानकारी दी। वहीं, चंदा कुमारी ने 'बेटी बचाओ-बेटी पढ़ाओ' योजना के तहत लैंगिक

समानता और शिक्षा के महत्व पर प्रकाश डाला।

डिजिटल दौर में साइबर सुरक्षा के महत्व को समझाते हुए शोभा कुमारी ने छात्राओं को एंटी-साइबर क्राइम के पहलुओं से अवगत कराया। उन्होंने बताया कि किसी भी तरह की ऑनलाइन टर्गी या साइबर अपराध की स्थिति में तुरंत टोल फ्री नंबर 1930 पर संपर्क करें। जागरूकता सत्र के दौरान छात्राओं के स्वास्थ्य पर विशेष ध्यान दिया गया। उन्हें मासिक धर्म स्वच्छता (Menstrual Hygiene) से संबंधित महत्वपूर्ण जानकारी दी गई ताकि वे स्वस्थ जीवन जी सकें। इस मौके पर पीएलवी (PLV) शबनम प्रवीण, संजीव कुमार, रूपेश्वर कुमार सहित विद्यालय के शिक्षक और बड़ी संख्या में छात्राएं उपस्थित रही।

बाल विवाह समाज के लिए श्राप: प्रवीण

मंडल रांची जिला विधिक सेवा प्राधिकरण की ओर से शुक्रवार को मंडल प्रखंड के कंजिया पंचायत के पुंगी गांव में बाल विवाह के खिलाफ 100 दिवसीय कार्रवाई के तहत विधिक जागरूकता कार्यक्रम का आयोजन किया गया। इस अवसर पर एलएडीसी चीफ प्रवीण कुमार श्रीवास्तव, पीएलवी सुमन ठाकुर, विनिता कुमारी, सोनी कुमारी, डॉ. अनिल कुमार, आफताब अंसारी, शमी अंसारी, तालिब अंसारी, कालेन्द्र गोप एवं राजा वर्मा समेत अन्य लोग उपस्थित थे। एलएडीसी चीफ, प्रवीण कुमार श्रीवास्तव ने कहा कि 18 साल से कम उम्र की लड़की और 21 साल से कम उम्र के लड़के का विवाह बाल विवाह कहलाता है। इससे शिक्षा बाधित होती है, जिससे भविष्य अंधकारमय होता है। इस दौरान विधि के छात्र-छात्राओं के द्वारा डायन-प्रथा, बाल श्रम, बाल अपराध तथा चरलेट हिंसा के बारे में भी जानकारी दी गई। पीएलवी सुमन ठाकुर ने उपस्थित लोगों को सरकार द्वारा चलायी जा रही लाकरी योजनाओं के बारे में जानकारी दिये। उन्होंने लोगों को विधवा पेंशन, वृद्ध पेंशन एवं प्रथममंत्री आवास योजना के बारे में भी जानकारी दी। कार्यक्रम के अंत में उपस्थित लोगों के बीच कुक्कड़ का भी वितरण किया गया।

02 Parents should educate their daughters and prevent child marriage : Suman Thakur

declares child marriage as a 'voidable marriage', under which the aggrieved party can apply to the court to annul the marriage within two years of attaining adulthood. PLV Harinam Karmali said that the court has the power to issue necessary injunctions to prevent potential child marriages, ensure the safety of the girl or boy, and order their placement in a protection home if needed. PLV Suman Thakur said that it is the legal and moral duty of every citizen to inform the District Legal Services Authority, Childline-1098, or the nearest police station upon receiving information about a child marriage. He also provided information about the toll-free number- 15100.



RANCHI : Under the direction of Justice-cum-Executive Chairman JHARHAND, Smt. Nityanand Prasad and under the guidance of Member Secretary, JHARHAND, Kumari Ranjana Asthana, Judicial Commissioner, Ranchi, Anil Kumar Mishra-1 and under the supervision of DLSA Secretary, Rakesh Raushan a legal awareness program was organized on 29.01.2026 at the Bole Paschayati Bhawan under Chando block, as part of the 100-days action against child marriage, under the ASHA campaign launched by the NALSA. PLV Suman Thakur said that the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006 is in force in India to prevent child marriage, according to which the minimum age for marriage is 21 years for boys and 18 years for girls. Marriage at an age younger than this is a legal offense. PLV Nidhyun said that this Act

Ranchi: The executive chairman of the Jharkhand State Legal Services Authority (Jhalsa) and judge of the Jharkhand high court, Justice Sujit Narayan Prasad, on Saturday expressed concern over the cases of missing children and child trafficking. He asked the para-legal volunteers (PLVs) to be more alert on the issue.

Addressing principal and district judges, district legal service authority secretaries, panel advocates, legal aid defense counsel and the PLVs from across the state, he said, "Jhalsa has deployed PLVs at police stations, hospitals, schools, railways stations, panchayats, and remote areas. They should be alert and provide inputs to authorities for immediate action."

"Measures should be taken to ensure that the rescued victims are not trafficked again. Adequate employment opportunity within the state would enable youths to remain here. Rescued children should be linked to self-help groups so as to help them earn a livelihood," he added.

He also stressed the importance of sensitive handling of cases related to trafficking and offences under child protection laws.

The two days meet followed by **five technical sessions**, aimed at reviewing existing mechanisms and strengthening institutional capacities. The sessions covered key topics including:

1. Providing quality legal aid through the **Legal Aid Defence Counsel System (LADCS)** and the panel lawyer system.
2. Empowering PLVs by enhancing their competence and community outreach, including the role of legal aid clinics.
3. Legal assistance to prison inmates and ensuring legal support at the stages of pre-arrest, arrest and remand.
4. Strengthening **Permanent Lok Adalats (PLAs)** and improving the performance of DLSAs in alternative dispute resolution mechanisms.
5. Accounts and audit management within legal services institutions.

These sessions saw active participation from DLSA Chairpersons and Secretaries, LADCs, PLA Chairpersons, Mediators, Panel Lawyers and PLVs. State-Level Legal Services–cum–Empowerment Camps have emerged as an effective platform for promoting legal awareness, ensuring access to justice, and facilitating the delivery of government welfare schemes to marginalized and underprivileged sections of society. These camps play a crucial role in bridging the gap between the administration and the public by providing on-the-spot legal assistance, spreading awareness about rights and entitlements, and addressing important social issues. They also strengthen the outreach of legal services institutions by ensuring that the benefits of various schemes reach the last mile in a timely and efficient manner.

In continuation of these efforts, several State-Level Legal Services–cum–Empowerment Camps have been organized by JHALSA across different districts of Jharkhand under the guidance of **Hon'ble Mr. Justice Sujit Narayan Prasad**, Judge, High Court of Jharkhand & the Executive Chairman, JHALSA. These camps aimed at promoting legal awareness, ensuring access to justice, and facilitating the delivery of government welfare schemes to marginalized and underprivileged sections of society. JHALSA also undertook due diligence to identify districts with significant populations of primitive tribes, ensuring that these communities were included in the empowerment initiatives. The State-Level Legal Services–cum–Empowerment Camps organized by JHALSA during the year 2025–2026 are as follows:

Khunti gang rape: 2 out of 18 minor culprits to be tried as adults: DGP

Ranchi: Two out of the 18 minor boys, who were detained in connection with the gang rape of three minor girls and the molestation of two others in Khunti's Rania police station limits would be tried as adults, DGP Anurag Gupta said on Tuesday. The two would be tried as adults as they were above 16 years of age when the crime was committed, Gupta said.

Talking to the media on the sidelines of the ongoing budget session at the Jharkhand Vidhan Sabha, Gupta said police would ensure aid to the survivors under the state govt's Victim's Compensation Act of 2012. "Our focus is to ensure that the culprits are put to trial on a fast-track basis," he said.

Gupta's statements came on the same day when Khunti police produced five minor survivors before the district child welfare committee (CWC), which recorded their statements. The

medical examination of the survivors and the arrested minor boys involved in the crime has already been conducted, the district police said.

Meanwhile, the Jharkhand high court judge and executive chairman of the Jharkhand State Legal Service Authority (JHALSA), Justice S N Prasad, took suo-moto cognizance of the incident and directed the Khunti district legal services authority (DLSA) meet the gang-rape survivors and provide them the required assistance.

On Tuesday, a DLSA team met the survivors and

provided Rs 10,000 each to their families. The DLSA would provide free legal service, support persons and ensure medical aid to the girls, DLSA officials said, adding that the team has also initiated the process for providing aid under the victim's compensation scheme.

Under the scheme, the survivors would be compensated between Rs 4 lakh and Rs 8 lakh. JHALSA secretary Ranjana Asthana said, "The DLSA would pursue the case of the survivors till its disposal. Protection would also be provided under the witness protection act."

HON'BLE EXECUTIVE CHAIRMAN, JHALSA DIRECTED TO PROVIDE TIMELY RELIEF TO VICTIM FAMILY IN LOHARDAGA DISTRICT

In a tragic incident involving the brutal killing of three members of the same family on allegations of witchcraft in Kekrang bar Toli village under Peshrar Police Station, Lohardaga district, the JHALSA took prompt action.

Hon'ble Mr. Justice Sujit Narayan Prasad, Judge of the High Court of Jharkhand and Executive Chairman, JHALSA, issued necessary directions to ensure immediate response and coordination at the district level. In compliance, the Principal District Judge-cum-Chairman, DLSA, Lohardaga, convened an urgent meeting with the Superintendent of Police and the SDPO, Lohardaga to review the situation and ensure appropriate action.

The team of District Legal Services Authority, Lohardaga reached out to the affected family, extended support, and submitted a detailed report to JHALSA highlighting the needs of the victim family.

Considering the gravity of the incident and the immediate requirements of the affected family, Hon'ble Executive Chairman, JHALSA, directed that Rs. 20,000/- be provided as immediate financial assistance. Acting on this direction, the Secretary, DLSA Lohardaga, visited the village and handed over a cheque of Rs.20,000/- to the victim family from out of Cost Fund of DLSA, Lohardaga.

News published on 24.02.2025 in the regional and local news paper, shocked the entire state about the inhuman act done against the five minor girls. JHALSA directed to report the DLSA Khunti. Further on the directions of Principal District & Session Judge-cum-Chairman, DLSA Khunti, DLSA team along with secretary DLSA rushed towards the place of incident of village nischitpur, P.S. – Rania, Khunti to meet the victims and their parents. It was ensured by the local Administration and police personnel that all the necessary steps have been taken and provided medical treatment and legal assistance to victims. Parents/Guardians were also interacted by the DLSA teams. Victims were referred to Torpa Health Care Centre for the necessary and primary medical checkup. Govt. Sadar Hospital officials were also called up and requested to give medical attention to the victims and to give up to date report to DLSA, Khunti.

During the interaction with the parents/Guardians of the victims they shown their willingness to avail Legal Aid. PLVs present at Torpa were directed to give all legal assistance from writing of application to connect with the local police and administration. When asked about the Govt. schemes from the parents of the victims, they replied about the receiving of Abua Awas Yojna Schemes. Local Administration also ensured about to provide benefits of other schemes of the Govt. which has not been availed by the victims family till date.

Further on the direction of JHALSA a sum of Rs. 10,000/- was given to each victim from the cost fund of DLSA, khunti and process for payment for Interim Victim Compensation were also initiated. The official mobile number of DLSA, Khunti also given to the family members of the victims for any kind of help and assistance required.

Acting swiftly, the matter was brought to the notice of the Principal District & Sessions Judge-cum-Chairman, DLSA, and a team was immediately deputed to the spot. With the support of the Mukhiya and Sarpanch, the team held discussions with community elders and parents, explaining the legal consequences and harmful effects of child marriage. Through dialogue and awareness, the community was convinced to stop the marriage. The children were assured continued support for education and well-being, reinforcing the commitment of DLSA Pakur towards protecting children's rights and promoting social justice at the grassroots level.

PROTECTING THE DIGNITY AND RIGHTS OF AN ELDERLY WOMAN

District Legal Service Authority, Ranchi

The District Legal Services Authority (DLSA), Ranchi intervened promptly in a serious case of physical and mental abuse of an 85-year-old widow, Smt. Sumitra Sinha, by her son and daughter-in-law. Upon receiving information, an immediate spot inspection was conducted in coordination with the local police to assess her condition. DLSA ensured regular food arrangements, continuous monitoring through a Para Legal Volunteer, and sensitised the victim about her legal rights under the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007. Local police were directed to ensure her protection and prevent further harassment. Legal assistance and safeguards were extended to secure her safety, dignity, and property, reaffirming DLSA's commitment to elder justice and humane care.

DLSA GUMLA 'S TIMELY INTERVENTION : RESCUED A CHILD FROM PLATFORM TO CLASSROOM

During a routine awareness visit to Pokla Railway Station and interacting with passengers and railway staffs, a DLSA Gumla team member noticed a young boy wandering alone on the platform.

On questioning, the truth emerged—the boy had run away from his home and fallen into bad company. He had left school months ago and at the age of 14 only he was trying to survive by doing small jobs at the station.

The team immediately stepped into the matter and brought him to the Child Welfare Committee (CWC), Gumla ensuring his safety and proper care. After counseling and contacting his family, his parents were traced from a distant village of Dist:- Gumla. The reunion was emotional. His parents, overwhelmed with relief, promised to take better care of him. With guidance and support, the boy was re-enrolled in school, given a second chance to rebuild his life. As he walked back home holding his parents' hands, there was hope in his eyes—hope for a better future, and a life back on the right track.
